#### Leadeship Project

In 2011, Lenize Patton found out that there were three hundred seventy-six homeless children living in Onslow County. That broke her heart, and God did not let her forget it. In December of 2012, Lenize and her husband purchased twelve rental units in hopes of collaborating with organizations that worked with the homeless. She named the new business Philippians Place Rentals, based on the Bible verses, Philippians 2:1-5. In 2014, Lenize started a non-profit that provides transitional housing for the homeless. Now, Philippians Place is expanding to include a homeless prevention program and a voucher program; these programs will be offered at a stand-alone facility with their new partner, Brookwood Baptist Church.

Philippians Place will assist people in need by providing them the opportunity to volunteer, participate in classes or Bible studies, and/or make crafts to earn vouchers for furniture, household items, and/or non-food products. Philippians Place will also provide

these opportunities to people in need of financial assistance to prevent an eviction and/or utility shut-off. Philippians Place will teach various classes (budgeting, job applications, job skills, crafting, etc.) and Bible Studies, which will be offered during the day and evenings. Clients can volunteer in the donation center to inventory, clean, and/or repair donations, or in the shop to organize, set up, and serve customers. Finally, our clients can volunteer in our community garden; they can attend classes, plant, weed, and harvest in the garden.

This year, the Jacksonville.Onslow Chamber of Commerce Leadership Class is working closely with Philippians Place to design, fundraise, and install the most recent component of Philippians Place, the Community Garden. Currently, the class's efforts have raised approximately ten percent of the needed funding; they are actively reaching out to local businesses for donations for a raffle tickets style fundraiser, as well as for in-kind donations to be used in the garden itself. Additionally, some local companies, youth groups, the Wounded Warrior program, and school groups will be volunteering their time and energy for one of the three workdays

scheduled on February 17th, March 24th, and April 14th.

We encourage anyone who is willing to assist this program through monetary or in-kind donations, or items that could be raffled off as part of a fundraiser, to please contact Philippians Place directly, or by e-mailing the Community Garden Project Co-Chair, Brenna Leger at brennaleger@yahoo.com. 



## Councilmember Angelia Washington Appointed to National League of Cities Committee

Second Committee for Councilmember

Jacksonville City Councilmember Angelia J. Washington, has been appointed to the National League of Cities Council for Race, Equity and Leadership.

Previously, Councilmember Washington had served on the Human Development federal advocacy committee for three years, and most recently served as vice chair. Washington was the first African American Jacksonville City Council member to be appointed to a NLC leadership position.

The appointment was announced by NLC First President Mark Stodola, Mayor, Little Rock, Arkansas. This committee has the responsibility for strengthening the knowledge and capacity of local elected officials to eliminate racial disparities, heal racial tensions, and build more equitable communities.

"I'm excited as councilwoman to continue my leadership at the national level," said Washington. "This appointment allows me to collaborate with municipal leaders across America in garnering support from Congress in establishing the 13th Amendment as a national holiday. Advocacy for our nation's citizens further supports action by the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to address violence among young African American males, improving educational outcomes for disadvantage students, and ending homelessness for civilians, veterans, and immigrants."

The Council is comprised of members who represent leaders from the policy and advocacy committees, constituency groups, member networking councils, and other advisory groups. It is a one-year appointment with options for reappointment.

A native of Jacksonville, NC, Washington is a Ph.D. candidate, North Carolina Agricultural & Technical State University, Greensboro, NC. She possesses a Master of Social Work (Clinical Social Work), Smith College, Northampton, MA; Bachelor of Science in Social Work, Metropolitan State University of Denver, Denver, CO, and a Bachelor of Science in Nursing, East Carolina University, Greenville, NC.
