





Craig and Carla Torrey. Their efforts, events and initiatives have salvaged and improved the history of a special part of Onslow County. As founders of the Ocean City Jazz Festival, these two amazing individuals go beyond to preserve and celebrate the mile strip of land in North Topsail Island known as Ocean City; the first NC coastal community in which Blacks could purchase land, 15 years before the Civil Rights Act.

He has immense dedication to Onslow County including memberships in Rolling Thunder®, Inc., Chapter NC-5, the Second Marine Division Association, the Disabled American Veterans (DAV) and the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW). He serves as a Beirut Memorial Advisory Board member, is an Honorary Life Member of the Beirut Veterans of America and is currently serving as Chairman of the MCB Camp Lejeune Military Retiree Council (MRC).

LaShea Caver. After serving 20 years in the Marine Corps retired from the line of military service in February 2016 to enter a new line of work by serving the public as an Independent Consultant for Legal Shield. She is a member of the Jacksonville Onslow Chamber of Commerce and proudly serves on the Ambassador Committee, Small Business and the Minority Business Services Committee. She continues to pursue her academic career and will graduate this month with a Bachelor's degree, majoring in Psychology and minoring in Business with plans to achieve her Masters and PhD in Industrial/Organizational Psychology.



## November's Service Member of the Month Sgt Coley C. Chestnut II, USMC

Sgt Coley Chestnut is distinguished as the Service Member of the Month (SMOM) for the month of November by the Jacksonville•Onslow Chamber of Commerce Military Affairs Committee.

Sgt Chestnut was born in 1993 in Selma, Alabama to Coley and Tonya Chestnut. While growing up Sgt Chestnut was continuously active in sports, specifically baseball and football. In May 2101, he graduated high school from Selma High School. That summer he enrolled into Concordia College Alabama to further his education, but during his second semester, he decided to enlist into the Marine Corps. In May 2013, he went to recruit training at Parris Island, South Carolina. In August of 2013, he graduated recruit training and continued his follow on training at Camp Geiger, North Carolina and then on to Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri to earn his Military Occupation as a Motor Vehicle Operator. After the completing of Motor Vehicle Operators Course, he checked into General Support Motor Transportation of CLR-2 in January of 2014. In May 2014, he was assigned TAD orders to be an instructor at the 2d MLG Motor Vehicle Incidental Drivers School. He was promoted to the rank of Corporal in August 2015 and returned back to his parent command, 2d Transportation Support Battalion. On March 23 2017, he and his wife had their first son and on the day, he was named Non-Commissioned Officer of the Quarter for his battalion at 2d Transportation Support Battalion. He was promoted to the rank of Sergeant on October 1, 2017. Sgt Chestnut and his wife had their second son in August 2018. On October 1, Sgt Chestnut was announced as the Non-Commissioned Officer of the Quarter for his battalion, and on October 2, 2018, he was announced as the regimental NCO of the Quarter.

Sgt Chestnut's leadership states that he ability to lead, train, and mentor directly contributed to him being nominated for 2d Transportation Support Battalion Non-Commissioned Officer of the Quarter and Combat Logistics Regiment 2 Non-Commissioned Officer of the Quarter. The Speakers for the Governmental Affairs Committee meeting on November 5th were Brent Anderson and Steve Meyers. They gave the group an update on Onslow County Schools. Board of Education member Ken Reddic also attended. They gave a slideshow revealing the tremendous damage done to our schools. All the facilities had some damage; ten schools had major damage and 14 had moderate damage. Due to the time without power all the schools had mold. Some students and staff are still displaced from their homes. The short-term repairs are underway. The long-term repairs may take one to two years. All the schools have had air quality testing and all passed. Earl Taylor, also a Board of Education member, is a GAC member.
