November's Service Member of the Month Sergeant Ken R. Tolentino

Since entering the Marine Corps, Sgt. Tolentino has been meritoriously promoted not once, but twice,

Born in the Philippines March 2, 1998, the son of Cedric Tolentino and Lordita Bryant, and brother to his younger sister, Kaye, our honoree now claims Sacramento, California, as his home town. He would tell you, that He has enrolled with the American Military University where he hopes to it was quite an adjustment moving to the states in his teenage years. While attain an electrical engineering degree. his parents came to the US for a better job and lifestyle, he suffered from a bit of culture shock, struggling through the language barrier and fitting in at his new high school in Elk Grove, California. He admits that he was a bit reserved, didn't really like talking with people and was probably a bit of a "math geek."

He did share that there was a lot of military presence in his school and upon graduation from Pleasant Grove High in 2016, he and a number of his friends felt that serving their country was their best option

In September of 2016, he reported to Marine Corps Recruiting Depot Congratulations to the November Service Member of the Month, Sergeant (MCRD) San Diego, where he graduated from recruit training three months Ken R. Tolentino. later. From there, he went on to Marine Combat Training (MCT) at Camp Pendleton, and upon completion received orders to Basic Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Technician School in Marine Corps Engineer School here at Courthouse Bay where he received the Military Occupation Specialty (MOS) of 1161. Promoted to Private First Class in March of 2017 and graduating two months later, he then reported to Engineer Company, Combat Logistics

Battalion 6, 2nd Marine Logistics Group. Attached with the Logistics Combat Element of Special Purpose Marine Air Ground Task Force (SPMAGTF) Response Africa 17.2/18.1, he was deployed to Italy and served as the Assistant Hazmat NCO and Assistant Safety NCO. In November of 2017, he was promoted to Lance Corporal. In March of 2018, this Lance Corporal returned to Camp Lejeune and served as the Assistant Defense Reutilization and Marketing Office (DRMO) representative of Engineer Company. In June, it was back to Courthouse Bay for the Advance Engineer Equipment Electrical System Technician Course where he graduated and was later meritoriously promoted to Corporal by the end of last year. At the beginning of this year, in January, he was sent to Integrated Training Exercise (ITX) at 29 Palms, where he provided engineer support to Combat Logistics Battalion 6. Returning here in March, he reported to his current unit, Combat Logistics Regiment 27, where he now serves as Training NCO for Maintenance Platoon, Communications Company.

Since signing up for a four-year reenlistment this past July, this young Marine has been nominated for NCO of the first quarter FY2020, and less than three weeks ago was again meritoriously promoted, this time to the

rank of Sergeant. He has orders to Combat Logistics Company (CLC) 36 in Iwakuni, Japan, in January 2020.

Outside his Marine Corps service, our Service Member of the Month enjoys working out in the gym, spending time with his fellow Marines while off duty, and volunteering in the community with the Jacksonville City Recreations and Parks, the Sneads Ferry Shrimp Festival, the East Carolina Youth Football League, the Fish Strong Foundation, and even babysits at his church.

A few quotes form his commanding officer, Colonel Mullery:

- "He has performed each billet with tireless dedication and selfless devotion."
- "His technical expertise, proficiency as a Marine leader, physical fitness, and overall performance have earned him the honor of this nomination."
- "He is the embodiment of our institutional core values and is an exceptional example of the full-Marine concept."


